North of US 64, and continuing through Tennessee's Cherokee National Forest, through a small portion of North Carolina's Nantahala National Forest, then across the Great Smoky Mountains National Park, where the trail rejoins the Appalachian Trail.

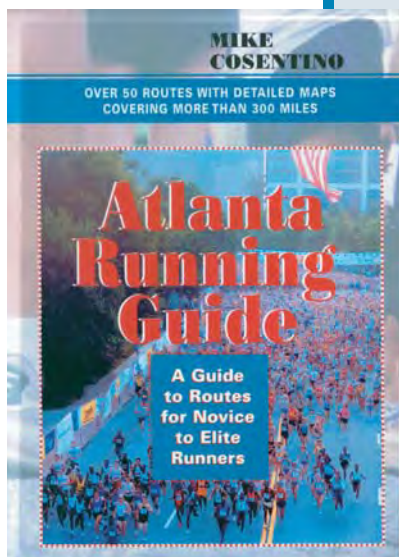

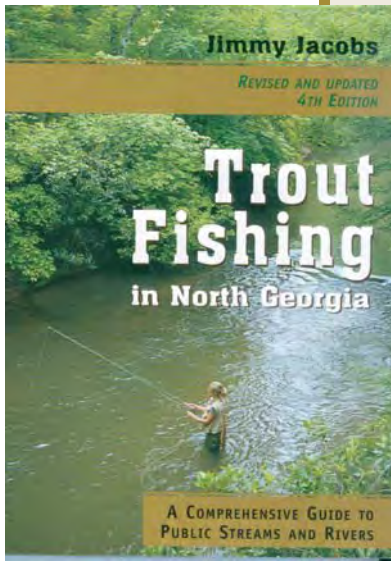
