A fish swims by bending its body from side to side. Its strong tail pushes it forward through the water. Paired fins on its sides help it start, stop, and turn. Top and bottom fins help a fish keep its balance. Fish with slim fins and a narrow tail can swim fast. Fish with large, wide fins and a square tail swim slowly, but they can turn quickly.
